An opportunity to take stock ...

Development of a dedicated CYP Director and portfolio recognises the challenges CYP face as we come out of the pandemic, our commitment to tackle health inequalities and support our next generation to flourish and thrive in their communities.

This review is an opportunity to take stock of where we are now, understand our challenges and opportunities and how we can best organise ourselves to respond and make a difference and reduce health inequalities. We have designed a four-step project plan to achieve this over four months.

It will enable us to shape and agree the ICS CYP portfolio, including how it will support and integrate with our Places, its scope, methods, priorities, resource and governance.





Purpose and approach...

This review will take a positive approach, placing CYP at its centre. It will be focused on engaging and listening to our Places and providers to learn about the CYP landscape across our system and building and reinforcing connections and collaborations.

In this way, we will build a collective understanding of where we have great practice, where we have common challenges we need to address and how together we can tackle inequalities and improve the health and wellbeing of our children and young people across our areas.





Four steps for the review

STEP ONE

1. Where are we now?

Including:

- creating a baseline view of all of the CYP transformation projects at Place, within provider partners (statutory and third sector) and across the ICS
- our population health intelligence and insight on inequalities, deprivation and outcomes
- the feedback we have from CYP, families and staff

Activities planned for this 1st step:

- Producing a visual map of the current CYP projects and programmes, groups and networks.
- Interviews with a wide range of stakeholders
- Place based mini-workshops
- Insights and intelligence session
- Workshop at the end to test composite picture of ‘where are we now?’ and identify our biggest CYP challenges



Four steps for the review

STEP TWO

What are the biggest challenges for CYP services and how do we rise to them?

Identifying the issues facing CYP that we are most concerned about, including issues with access, capacity, unmet need and disconnected care.

Road testing some of our biggest challenges to understand how the ICS CYP programme can help respond, support and transform services.





Four steps for the review

STEP THREE: Agreeing our key priorities for 2022-24

Engaging partners to prioritise what we do together over the next two years and the improvements we want to make at organisation, place and system level.

STEP FOUR: Organising to deliver

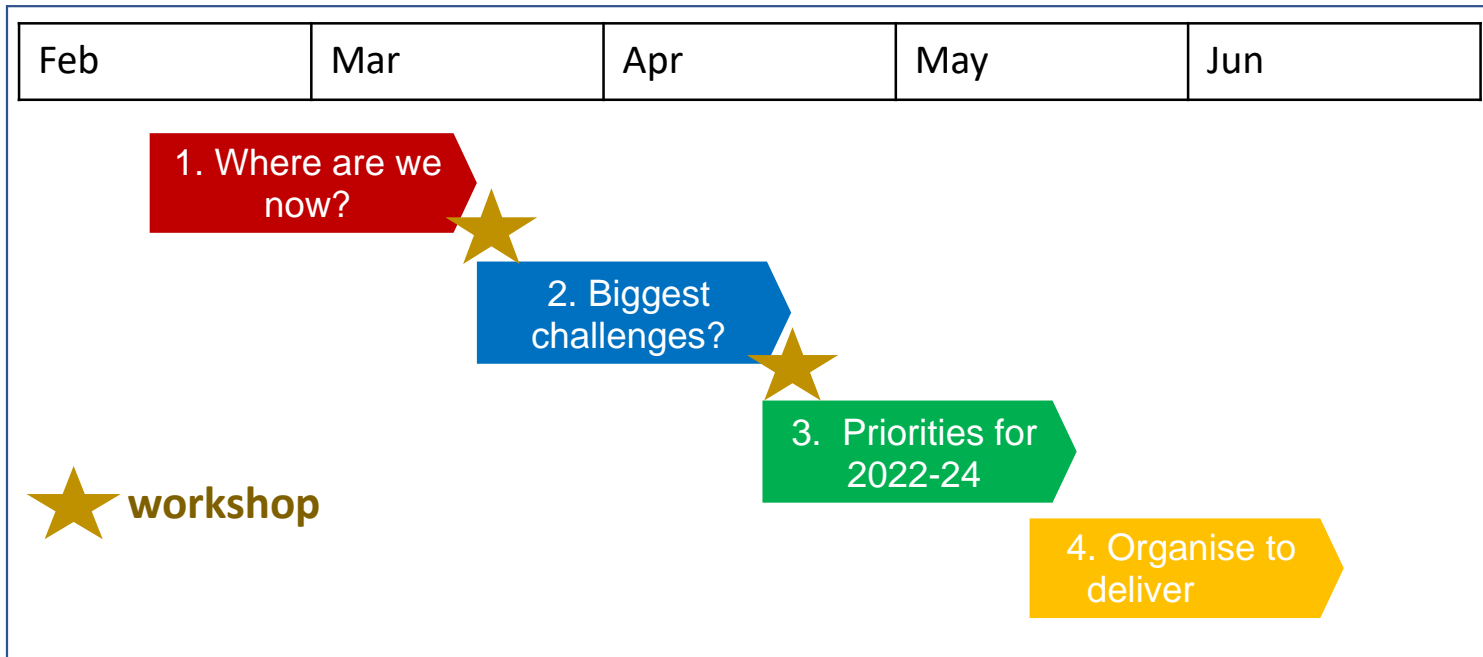
Agreeing how the ICS CYP Portfolio will support the delivery of our priorities, including leadership, effective joint working, governance and resourcing.
